Weekly Summary (June 1 - 7, 2024)

Conflicts and Casualties

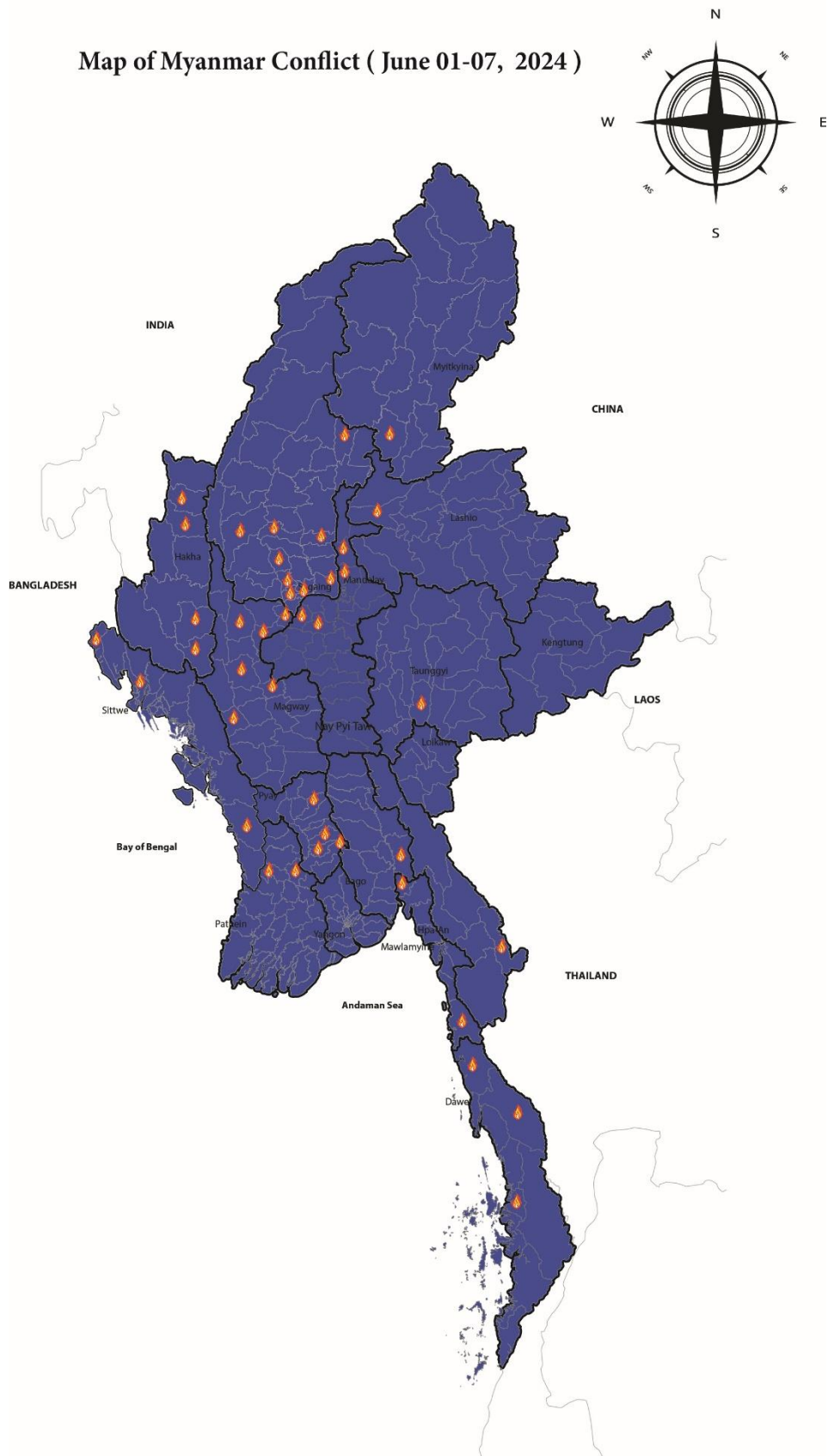
- There were 89 soldiers of the Military Council killed and 4 members of the People's Defense Forces were killed in attacks by NUG-affiliated PDFs in various parts of Myanmar.
- Fighting started and continued between the Arakan Army (AA) and the Military Council in Thandwe Township, in Rakhine State only one mile away from Ngapali Airport (Thandwe Airport). The No. 6 Border Guard Division (NAK 6) based in India, Maungdaw Township, was captured by the Arakan Army (AA) on June 6, 2024.
- Fighting continued between Chin Revolutionary Forces and Military Council Forces in Tedim Township, Chin State.
- A fierce battle broke out between the Military Council's Aung Zeya column and the Karen National Liberation Army (KNLA) joint forces near Myawaddy, Karen State.
- Intense fighting erupted as the Kachin Independence Army (KIA) undertook an offensive operation against the Military Council camps in Mongmit Township, in Shan State (North).

Civilian Casualties /Deaths / Losses

- There were 111 civilians killed due to aerial and heavy weapons attacks by the Military Council in various parts of Myanmar. Among those killed, there were 5 women and 6 children.
- There were 75 civilians arrested by the Military Council.
- There were 41 civilian houses burnt down by the Military Council in Tedim Township, Chin State.
